FATHER NOTES: Sergeant David TEED-41254

General: He served with the 3rd Battalion of Delancey's Brigade, also known as "Delancey's Cowboys from 1777 till 1783. He appears on a Muster Roll of Captain George Trumbull's Company of Delancey's 3rd Battalion dated October 26, 1777 as a Sergeant.

He was awarded a 200 acre Loyalist Land Grant at "River Remsheg" in 1785

He filed a claim for 2 sets of blacksmith's tools and cattle that were confiscated.

First Generation

1. **Sergeant David TEED**¹⁻² was born in 1760 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. He died on 24 Sep 1866 at the age of 106 in Cumberland, Nova Scotia, British North America. He served with the 3rd Battalion of Delancey's Brigade, also known as "Delancey's Cowboys from 1777 till 1783. He appears on a Muster Roll of Captain George Trumbull's Company of Delancey's 3rd Battalion dated October 26, 1777 as a Sergeant.

He was awarded a 200 acre Loyalist Land Grant at "River Remsheg" in 1785

He filed a claim for 2 sets of blacksmith's tools and cattle that were confiscated.

Second Generation

2. **Daniel TEED UE** was born about 1733 in Huntington, Suffolk, New York, British America. He died in 1780 at the age of 47 in Westchester County, New York, British America. He was a farmer and a blacksmith before the revolutionary war.

It is unknown if he died as a result of his military service. Elizabeth Ann AYRES and Daniel TEED UE were married about 1759 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America.

3. **Elizabeth Ann AYRES** was born about 1742 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. She died after 1786 at the age of 44 in , Westchester, New York, United States.

Daniel TEED and Elizabeth Ann AYRES had the following children:

 - i. **Sergeant David TEED**, born 1760, Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America; died 24 Sep 1866, Cumberland, Nova Scotia, British North America.
 - ii. **Lavinia TEED** was born about 1761 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America.
 - iii. **Moses TEED UE** was born about 1762 in Courtlandt, Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. He died about 1840 at the age of 78 in Wallace Bay, Nova Scotia, British North America. He was assessed a "Poll Tax" of 1 shilling in both 1791 and in 1792. He was a stone cutter.
 - iv. **Charles TEED** was born about 1763 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. He died in , New York, United States.
 - v. **Mary TEED** was born on 24 Jan 1764 in Courtlandt, Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. She died before 1830 at the age of 66 in Cumberland, Nova Scotia, British North America.
 - vi. **Elizabeth TEED** was born about 1765 in Courtlandt, Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. She died in 1851 at the age of 86 in Sackville, Westmoreland, New Brunswick, British North America.
 - vii. **Daniel TEED UE**^{1,3} was born on 13 Jun 1767 in Courtlandt, Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. He died on 26 Jan 1869 at the age of 101 in Wentworth, Cumberland, Nova Scotia, Canada. He was a "Drummer Boy" with the 3rd Battalion of Delancey's Brigade, also known as "Delancey's Cowboys". He served from 1781 until evacuation in 1783..

He was awarded a 200 acre Loyalist Land Grant at "River Remsheg" in 1785.

He was assessed a "Poll Tax" of 5 shillings in 1791, and 2 shillings in 1792 in Cumberland County, Nova Scotia..

Third Generation

4. **Samuel TEED U.E.**^{2,4} was born about 1712 in Huntington, Suffolk, New York, British America. He died on 4 Sep 1804 at the age of 92 in Digby, Annapolis, Nova Scotia, British North America. Samuel Teed took an oath of Support to the United States of America on 26 September 1776, along with his sons Daniel, Samuel, David, Zophar, John, Isaac, James and Charles. They all signed that oath, with their name, which means that the family was literate.

On the 21st of March, 1777, Samuel Teed and most of his family travelled down the road beside the Hudson River to New York City. They settled into tents near Oyster Bay, Long Island, NY.

Samuel Teed (Tidd) was a Private in Colonel Beverley Robinson's Company in the "Loyal American Regiment." He served from 27 March 1777 through 23 August 1783.

Following the Revolutionary War, Samuel relocated to Digby, Annapolis County Nova Scotia. Anne Elizabeth LORING and Samuel TEED U.E were married on 10 Dec 1732 at 1st Church in Huntington, Suffolk, New York, British America.

5. **Anne Elizabeth LORING** was born on 6 Nov 1712 in Huntington, Suffolk, New York, British America. She died in 1780 at the age of 68 in , Westchester, New York, United States.

Samuel TEED and Anne Elizabeth LORING had the following children:

 - i. **Daniel TEED UE**, born abt 1733, Huntington, Suffolk, New York, British America; died 1780, Westchester County, New York, British America.
 - ii. **Private Samuel TEED UE** was born on 22 Feb 1735 in Huntington, Suffolk, New York, British America. He died Drowned in a storm in 1792 at the age of 57 in Bay of Fundy, Nova Scotia, British North America. He was a farmer and a Blacksmith.

Samuel Teed took the "Oath of Allegiance" to the United States of America on 26 September 1776. He signed that oath "Samuel Teed".

On the 21st of March, 1777, Samuel left his belongings, and took his family down the road along the Hudson River, through the British Lines. His family consisted of his wife Elizabeth and 5 children: Elizabeth, Thomas, Samuel, Mary and David.

He served in Colonel Beverly Robinson's Regiment, "The Loyal American Regiment", first appearing on their Muster Roll in November, 1777.

He joined about November, 1777, and stayed with them through 22 Aug 1783.

He was primarily stationed in New York, throughout the war.

- iii. **Phebe TEED** was born on 22 Feb 1736 in Huntington, Suffolk, New York, British America. She died in 1762 at the age of 26 in Half Moon, Albany, New York, British America.
- iv. **Elizabeth TEED** was born on 2 Nov 1740 in Cornwall, Orange, New York, British America. She died in 1792 at the age of 52 in Clifton Park, Ontario, New York, United States.
- v. **Sergeant David TEED U.E.**^{2,5} was born in 1742 in Courtlandt, Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. He died about 1838 at the age of 96 in Malagash, Cumberland, Nova Scotia, British North America. He filed a Loyalist claim, swearing that he and his parents had come into the British Lines in 1779, and that he had joined Colonel DeLancey's Refugees in August 1781 and had acted with them until June 1783.

He was granted 200 acres in Remsheg as a Loyalist.

He was assessed a "Poll Tax" of 5 shillings in both 1791 and 1792.

- vi. **Zophar TEED** was born on 28 Aug 1743 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. He died in Jan 1814 at the age of 70 in Montgomery, Orange, New York, United States.

- vii. **Ensign John TEED UE⁵** was born about 1744 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. He served with Delancey's Brigade (also known as "Delancey's Cowboys". He emigrated to Nova Scotia in 1783.

He received a 200 acre Loyalist Land Grant in "River Remsheg" in Cumberland County, Nova Scotia in 1785.

- viii. **Private Isaac TEED UE^{2,5}** was born about 1746 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. He died in Malagash, Cumberland, Nova Scotia, British North America. He served in "Delancey's Cowboys" along with his other 3 older brothers. Isaac was taken prisoner by the American Rebels, but was able to escape. He returned to Delancey's Brigade, and served until the end of the war.

He received a 200 Acre Loyalist Land Grant in River Remsheg, Cumberland County, Nova Scotia in 1785.

- ix. **Anne TEED** was born in 1748 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. She died before 1750 at the age of 2 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America.
- x. **Charles TEED** was born about 1748 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. He died before 26 Dec 1750 at the age of 2 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America.
- xi. **Private James TEED UE⁶** was born about 1749 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. He received a Loyalist Land Grant of 200 acres in "River Remsheg" , Cumberland County, Nova Scotia, Canada in 1785.

Very little is known about James Teed, other than his place in the birth order, and the fact that he received a Loyalist Land Grant.

- xii. **Charles TEED** was born on 26 Dec 1750 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. He died on 16 Sep 1804 at the age of 53 in Sodus, New York, United States. Charles Teed served with "Delancey's Cowboys", and was taken prisoner by the American Revolutionaries. He was not released until then end of the war, asfter his brothers had already sailed for Nova Scotia.
- xiii. **Keziah TEED** was born in 1755 in Cortlandt Manor, Westchester, New York, British America. She died in Hamilton, Butler, Ohio, United States.
