## **UELAC Dominion Office, Library & Archives Update**

Now that UELAC Dominion Office and the UELAC Library & Archives has officially moved into their new quarters within the Cornwall Community Museum at Lamoureux Park at 160 Water West, Cornwall, ON, the challenge begins to reorganize our space.

The Board of Directors will be hiring a part-time office staff in the fall. This new part-time, hired employee will be managing all Office Administrative duties. Other office needs are being managed by our present, part-time Office Administrator, Jim Bruce UE working at home on the financial side with the UELAC Treasurer, Barb Andrew UE.

While the UELAC Dominion Office, Library & Archives were housed at George Brown House in Toronto, the Library & Archives was not available for research for over 20 years, however, we did assist requests through 'look-ups' from our Library and Archives. When the new Cornwall UELAC facility is completely reorganized, we will be open to help researchers once staff/volunteers are available.

We do not expect to be open as a research facility until the new addition to the museum is built, however, we will continue to work on the digitization of records and documents of the association, in addition to the re-organizing of the UELAC Library and Archives as we continue to move forward. These records eventually, will be released as available on the uelac.ca Private Members Section of the website.

We must mention that the UELAC Library and Archives are separate entities. The library will be re-organized in the fall with the aide of two acquired local volunteers who have connections to the Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry Historical Society who operate the Cornwall Community Museum.

Presently, we have one part-time volunteer working at home on the Archival Records of the UELAC. These records are the organizational records of the Association since its formation.
